Census responses can't be used for law enforcement purposes or to determine eligibility for government benefits. You will NOT be asked for your social security number, financial or banking info.

• Programs Affected:

Medicaid and Medicare; SNAP (food stamps); CHIP (children's health insurance); Section 8, senior housing and LIHEAP; Transportation and nutrition services for seniors (Meals on Wheels included); Head Start and Special Education; Highway and Infrastructure; Veterans' Services; Legislative Representation.

All activities and special events are suspended.

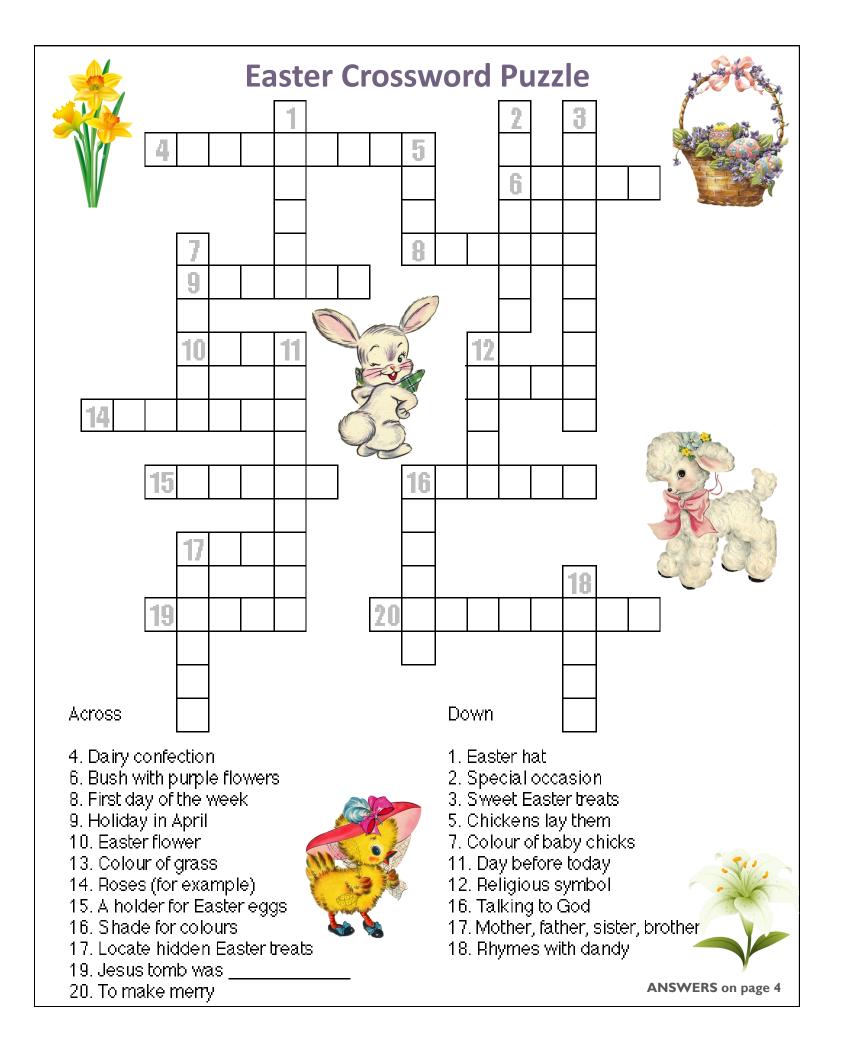
Meals on Wheels continues to operate on an altered schedule.

clude thorough cleaning and sanitizing, putting donated or delivered items into quarantine for the recommended amount of time, and having some staff work from home.

Other programs at the main office, such as help with benefits like unemployment, rental/utility assistance, and domestic violence counseling, are also still available and are being done primarily over the phone.

The Open Link is monitoring information and resources from experts in disease control. We also receive support from Montgomery County Senior Services and the Department of Health and Human Services to ensure we are doing everything we can to limit the risk of infection to ourselves and the people we serve.

Closing our doors is necessary, but we realize that senior centers closing may leave many people isolated. We encourage you to pick up the phone and call your friends, family and neighbors! Don't hesitate to reach out to someone if you are feeling lonely or make a call to someone who may be in need of a friend. We would also like to hear from you and we want to thank those of you who have already called.
